

ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS

Sealed bids for the project entitled **Lot 7 Water Line Relocation and Slope Repair** will be received by the **Town of Weaverville** at 2:00 p.m. local time January 10, 2012, in the Town of Weaverville Town Hall Council Chambers and then publicly opened and read aloud.

THE PROJECT GENERALLY CONSISTS OF

Alternate A: Installation of approximately 220 lf of 6" DIP water line to allow existing water line to be abandoned.

Alternate B: Removal and disposal of approximately 1,500 cubic yards of uncompacted, non-permitted earth fill over existing water line.

Copies of the Contract Documents may be obtained at the office of the Engineer, McGill Associates, P.A., located at 55 Broad Street, Asheville, North Carolina 28801 upon payment of \$75.00 for each set. There will be no refund to any party for Contract Documents so obtained. Neither the Owner nor the Engineer will be responsible for full or partial sets of Contract Documents, including any Addenda, obtained from any other source.

A pre-bid conference will be held at 2:00 pm on January 3, 2012, in the Town of Weaverville Town Hall Council Chambers. Interested parties are invited to attend this meeting to review the plans, ask for additional information or clarifications, and visit the project site.

A certified check or cashiers check payable to the Town of Weaverville or a satisfactory Bid Bond executed by a corporate surety licensed under the laws of North Carolina to execute such bonds in the amount equal to five percent of the highest Alternate Bid shall be submitted with each bid.

The Owner reserves the right to waive any informalities or reject any or all bids. The Owner reserves the right to award a contract to the lowest, responsive, responsible bidder.

The successful bidder shall be required to furnish separate, 100 percent Performance and Payment Bonds in compliance with North Carolina General Statutes Section 143-129 and of Article 3 of Chapter 44A. The Performance Bond shall be in full force and effect for one (1) year after the date of final acceptance of the project by the Owner.

The bid deposit shall be retained by the Owner if the successful bidder fails to execute the contract or fails to provide the required bonds, as stated above, within ten (10) days after award of the contract.

Each bidder must be appropriately licensed as a Contractor in the State of North Carolina as provided in General Statutes Chapter 87. Each bidder shall make positive efforts to use small and minority owned business enterprises on this project.

A conditional or qualified BID will not be accepted.
